back from Judge Striplin to see he is interested in resuming Municipal Court for Turin.

City of Trees: Mark Mitchell announced that there are four steps to becoming a Tree City: 1. An ordinance needs to be created. 2. A Tre Board will need to be appointed. 3. A budget commitment of at least \$2.00 per capita. 4. Need to schedule an Arbor Day Observance and Proclamation. Councilmember Stapp made

a motion to have the Town Attorney create an ordinance for Council review, seconded by Councilmember Bolden, VOTE: All in favor.

Park Land: Councilmember Bolden made a motion to create a Park Committee, seconded by

Councilmember Frnka. VOTE: All in favor.

Policy for TECHS funding: Councilmember Bolden made a motion for Attorney Mitchell to create a policy

for Council to review giving details to what the group will provide in exchange for the Town's funding,

seconded by Councilmember Stapp. VOTE: All in favor
